'23-'24 YEAR IN REVIEW

IMPACT & ENGAGEMENT

Programs and Community

- **Joined by 325 unique youth** - including 110 NEW youth - ages pre-k through 29 at our programs.
- **Attended 100+ community events** - 23 of which were Pride events - sharing our resources and connecting with community partners.
- **Sent 220+ outreach packets** to schools, libraries, and family centers, reaching youth across our catchment area.
- **Trained 380+ individuals** at our Education Sessions, cultivating LGBTQ+ competency amongst corporate partners and community members.
- **Renovated our Parent/Caregiver Space** providing a cozier environment in the waiting area and increased privacy for our youth.
- **OUTings** to Red Sox Pride Night, the Community Kiln to play with clay, and Brandeis University for a Drag Story Hour.

FUNdraising and Finance

- **Surpassed our Spring Appeal Goal** of \$25,000 to shelter trans and queer youth from the storm of anti-LGBTQ+ sentiments. Anyone who gave \$125+ received a rainbow OUT MetroWest umbrella.
- **Gathered with over 200** youth, partners, and community members at our 10th Annual Come OUT & Celebrate Gay-la. Peer Leaders gave speeches, Governor Maura Healey shared a special message, and the crowd supported LGBTQ+ youth by raising over \$148,000 in critical funds needed for our FREE programming.
- **Hosted Trivia Night in person** for the first time in 5 years. Missy Steak emceed for us at the Framingham Public High School for a night of facts, friends, and raising nearly \$25,000 for LGBTQ+ youth.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



Doubled programing for trans & nonbinary youth

Umbrella, our program for transgender and nonbinary youth, expanded from twice a month to once a WEEK gatherings for youth in high school, and added occasional offerings for youth in middle school. Umbrella featured a custom binder-making workshop and a presentation on healthy relationships for trans and gender expansive people.



Increased access to LGBTQ+ Role Models

Weekly programs are supported by the addition of 3 new Adult Advisors and 3 new youth Peer Leaders. These LGBTQ+ role models plan and facilitate our weekly programs, and foster a supportive environment that centers trans and queer youth. Our team represents a variety of LGBTQ+ identities to fully serve our community.



Engaged LGBTQ+ youth and their families

Over 125 youth and their families joined us for Shine and Glow, our programs for pre-k through grade 5. Activities included a pool party, mini golf, and a performance by Ants on a Log. OUT MetroWest also led the Elementary Age track at the Trans Youth Summit, providing a fun and supportive space for transgender youth.



Fostered queer joy with young adults

Nova, our program for LGBTQ+ young adults ages 19-29, drew more than 50 participants for programs such as Friendsgiving, a queer movie screening, and restaurant meet-ups. A record number of OUT MetroWest alums reconnected with us through Nova and leadership positions across the organization.
